Current Situation: Firefighters continue to enhance line in the area of Tenmile drainage and along Highway 101. Aircraft were able to engage in suppressive activity once the inversion layer cleared this afternoon. Drift smoke continues to be present throughout the Ukiah Valley and has been reported from as far away as Santa Rosa. Interior portions of the fire will continue to burn and may be visible from Highway 101. The American Red Cross has officially closed the Evacuation Shelter at Leggett School. Red Cross representatives have advised that it can be re-opened, should a need exist.

The **Evacuation Order** in the following areas has been downgraded to an **Evacuation Warning** – **Camp Seabow, Bowman Ranch, Hunt Ranch, Tan Oak Park, Elk Creek and Mad Creek.**

The **Evacuation Order** is still in effect for the areas south of Highway 101, west of Cummings Road to Leggett. These areas include: **The Hermitage, Big Bend and Camp St. Michael.** We will continue to evaluate the need for the evacuation order as the incident progresses.
