### Current Situation

A Red Flag Warning for abundant lightning and thunderstorms has been issued for portions of Northern California including the area of the Eiler Fire until Tuesday 11:00 a.m. There are many hot spots and flare ups within the fire perimeter in the area of Burney Mountain. These are visible from the surrounding communities, including Burney, Hat Creek, and Old Station, especially at night. Firefighters are taking advantage of cooler temperatures to strengthen control lines. Crews are aggressively constructing direct hand line utilizing Minimal Impact Suppression Tactics (MIST) in the Thousand Lakes Wilderness where control lines have proven challenging.
