Current Situation

Firefighters continue to mop up and patrol the fire perimeter. Crews are re-enforcing hand line and continuing to utilize Minimal Impact Suppression Tactics (MIST) in the Thousand Lakes Wilderness where control lines have proven challenging. Fire Suppression Repair Teams are actively engaged working around the fire perimeter and effected areas. Demobilization of resources continues, allowing them to be available for other incidents.
