Current Situation: The evacuations were lifted, allowing residents to return to their homes. Residents can access the area at North Davis Avenue at South Davis Avenue and Lincoln Avenue at Railroad Avenue and will be required to show identification with proof of residency. Fire suppression repair work is being completed around and within the fire perimeter. Additionally, fire crews continue to assist residents as they search for personal belongings amongst the debris. Excess resources are being released and made available for other incidents as necessary. Utility crews are continuing to assess and repair damaged equipment and infrastructure.

The City of Weed will be hosting a community meeting for all residents affected by the Boles Fire at 7:00PM on Sunday, September 21st in the theatre at the College of the Siskiyous, 800 College Ave., Weed CA.

If you feel you have information regarding the Boles Fire, please contact 1-800-468-4408. A reward may be offered up to \$10,000 leading to the cause of the fire.

Evacuation Center at the Mt. Shasta Armory located at: 518 Everett Memorial Hwy in Mt. Shasta, will remain open to provide shelter for displaced residents.
