Current

Situation: Fire is currently burning in steep rugged terrain making access for fire crews difficult. Resources will continue to work throughout the day to construct fire line, while additional resources continue to respond from around the State.

Evacuations: An Evacuation Advisory has been issued for The Double Eagle Ranch and homes along the Highway 20 corridor between New Long Valley Rd. and East of the county line. Mandatory evacuations West of Soda Creek and an advisory evacuation East of Soda Creek. The evacuation center in Clear Lake has been closed. An evacuation center was opened at Middletown High School in Middletown and is better suited to handle the evacuees. Evacuations are still in effect for the area North of Morgan Valley East of Bonham Rd, Jerusalem Grade Rd, Jerusalem Valley Rd, Canyon Rd, June Bug Rd, Spruce Grove Rd (North end), Noble Ranch Rd and Cantwell Ranch Rd.

Road Closures: Morgan Valley Road at Bonham, Rocky Creek Road, Mustang Court, Quarterhorse Road and Sleepy Hollow.
