SITUATION				
Current Situation:	The Bureau of Land Management has reopened the Lost Coast Trail in the King Range National Conservation Area, though some trails remain closed. Today crews will continue to work to put out hot spots and strengthen control lines in steep, rugged terrain. Vertical drops in some areas still pose challenges for ground resources. Access to the fire is extremely limited, requiring long hike in times and crew shuttling with helicopters. As containment on the fire increases, resources will transition to repair efforts while others will be demobilized. Motorists should drive cautiously and always yield to emergency vehicles that are traveling on and off of the roads and highways.
