SITUATION

Current Situation:	<p>A large demobilization of excess resources was conducted today. The fire suppression repair plan continues. CAL FIRE Incident Management Team 5 remains at base camp to support the incident and personnel. Strengthening of containment lines will continue throughout the night. Lack of available water sources due to extreme drought conditions has prompted the incident to work with local communities to utilize reclaimed water for incident support needs. Although there is no longer smoke visible from the Horse Fire, residents and commuters should be aware of drift smoke from other established wildland fires in the region.</p> <p>One less spark means one less wildfire.
