SOBERANES FIRE: EVACUATION ORDERS LIFTED FOR LIMITED AREAS

Effective at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, July, 29, 2016 the Monterey County Sheriff's Office has LIFTED EVACUATION ORDERS to include:

- **Riley Ranch Road and Red Wolf Drive**
- **Corona Road**
- **All of Carmel Highlands**

Road Closures/Restrictions have also been lifted for:

- **Riley Ranch Road at SR Highway 1 – Restrictions lifted, no closure**
- **Corona Road – Restrictions lifted, no closure**

EVACUATION ORDERS remain in effect for:

- Palo Colorado Road
- Old Coast Road
- Bixby Creek Road from Highway 1 south to Mesa
- Garrapatos Road
- Weston Ridge Road (aka Garrapatos Road)
- Robinson Canyon Road from San Clemente Trail to White Rock Gun Club Road
- Areas south of San Clemente Trail from Robinson Canyon to Rancho San Clemente Gate House (to include Arroyo Sequoia)
- Rancho San Carlos Road from Cantera Run to Garzas Trail

An Evacuation Warning remains in effect for:

- White Rock
- Old Coast Road, south from Bixby Creek Road to Little Sur River
- North of San Clemente Trail/Dormody Road, including roads that go to Black Mountain Trail
- Touche Pass, the community of San Clemente and all of Long Ridge Trail

SAFETY MESSAGE - The public is reminded to stay vigilant on current fire conditions. Please continue to adhere to road closures and any evacuation orders or warnings. If you see electrical wires on the ground, stay clear and contact PG&E immediately. Trees and poles with deep charring, particularly if still smoking, should be considered hazardous. Please drive slowly and yield to emergency personnel in the area.

As you re-enter your property and evaluate damage, be aware that hazardous conditions may exist, particularly if a residence or out-building has burned. Hazards may include asbestos, heavy metals, by-products of plastic combustion and various other chemicals.
