Current Situation: The fire burned actively throughout the night. A red flag warning remains in effect throughout the region. Today's objectives include continued suppression efforts utilizing ground and air resources.

CAL FIRE Incident Management Team 2 is working collaboratively with PG&E to assess damage and restore services in effected areas. A damage assessment has been assigned to the incident. Tonight, firefighters will continue constructing containment lines while strengthening and securing control lines.
