CURRENT SITUATION

Current Situation:	Firefighters continue to make progress constructing containment lines around the County Fire. Steep and inaccessible terrain has created difficulty for firefighters along the Northern portion of the fire. Higher temperatures, lower humidities and winds are expected to continue this weekend. This may influence fire activity and increase smoke production. Damage Inspection Teams continue to make progress surveying areas where fire activity has diminished. The number of damaged and destroyed structures reflected may change as teams continue to make progress.
