Current Situation:	Progress continues to increase on the County Fire. Firefighters are working aggressively to mop up and strengthen perimeter control lines. Unburned pockets of fuel continue to actively burn within the interior of the fire. Higher temperatures, lower humidities and winds are expected to continue this week. Damage Inspection Teams continue to make progress surveying areas where fire activity has diminished. The number of damaged and destroyed structures reflected may change as teams continue to make progress.
