Current Situation:	Progress continues to increase on the County Fire. Firefighters are aggressively working to strengthen perimeter control lines, mop up and tactically patrol. Unburned pockets of fuel continue to burn within the interior of the fire. Fire Suppression Repair Teams are actively engaged working around the fire perimeter and affected areas. All Evacuation Orders have been lifted and PG&E has restored power to all areas affected by the fire.
