LICK FIRE NOW 45% CONTAINED

The Lick Fire has burned a total of 37,660 acres in and near Henry W. Coe State Park. Lower temperatures helped firefighters in their efforts to increase the percentage of containment.

- The fire started shortly before 2 PM on September 3rd
- The fire is burning in grass, heavy brush, oak woodlands and some timber
- The fire is now 45% contained
- The fire has destroyed 1 outbuilding
- 25 residential units and ten outbuildings are threatened
- There are now 1,911 personnel on the incident
- Air tankers were not able to fly due to limited visibility. Helicopters were used to help ground crews in the suppression efforts.
- There have been four firefighter injuries
- The estimated cost of the fire to date is 4,827,055
- The fire originated from within an illegal debris barrel
- Henry W. Coe State Park is closed to the public
