### Bullards Fire Update

**Camptonville .. ..** This morning, the Bullards Fire was relatively quiet as cooler temperatures and higher humidities decreased burning activity. Along the western edge of the reservoir, the fire continued to spot and back down toward Oregon Hill Road.

Weather outlook for tomorrow is partly cloudy with a slight chance of showers. Humidity will be 33% with a high of 69 degrees. Light winds in the morning with moderate gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

NorCal Team II has transitioned into Unified Command. The Incident Command Post has been established at the Nevada County Fairgrounds.

**Size** – estimated 850 acres

**Containment** – 10%

Evacuations are still in effect for the Bullards Bar Reservoir and Campgrounds, Moonshine Road, Oregon Hill Road to Moran Rd, Kelly Road, County Road 169, Sioux Trail areas. Marysville Road is closed beginning at Merriam Road to Hwy 49. Moonshine Road is closed.

1 injury confirmed – broken foot

The fire began Friday afternoon and is burning in Yuba County south of Bullards Bar Reservoir on both sides of the North Yuba River in the Tahoe and Plumas National Forests. The cause is under investigation.
