The Buckeye Fire is burning in steep, rugged terrain near Buckeye Mountain east of Petrolia and north of Conklin Creek Road. Fire line has been completed around the fire perimeter. Crews will continue today with mop up and control of hot spots within the fire's interior. Demobilization of some resources has begun. Although temperatures are expected to warm up today, conditions are still favorable.
