Current Situation: The fire is burning in a mix of grass, brush, oak and pine trees in steep, rugged terrain on the Los Coyotes Indian Reservation and the Anza Borrego Desert State Park. The fire is moving toward the northwest and is visible from the desert community of Borrego Springs. The Borrego Palm Canyon Trail and Campground in the Anza Borrego Desert State Park are closed.
