Current Situation: Firefighters have been very successful with their firing operations over the last 24 hours. The fire continues to burn pockets of fuel within the containment lines which will lead to additional smoke in the area. Favorable weather conditions are expected to continue, and any additional spread of the fire is expected to be minimal. Demobilization of some resources continues, and will increase over the next few days. Many of these resources will be redeployed to new fires that have recently started or continue to burn throughout Northern California.

Road Closures: There are currently no road closures. Highway 16 has been reopened. A smoke advisory for Highways 16 and 20 is in effect for decreased visibility in the area. Motorists are advised to use extra caution and to be alert for fire vehicles and the possibility of debris on the roadway.

Evacuations: There are no current evacuation orders. The residents of the Cortina Rancheria have returned to their homes.
