Current Situation: Firefighters are making good progress. Focus will continue on building and holding containment line. Temperatures are in the high 80's, with low relative humidity. Murphy Springs Road is open to residence only.

Road Closures: Murphy Springs Road closed to public.

Evacuations: Lifted as of Oct 19 at 3:00 PM.

Additional Information: PG&E continues to work on restoring power to residence in the area. Due to CAL FIRE personnel levels being held to "peak staffing" through the end of October, personnel and resources were readily available to aggressively battle this wildland incident. The wildland fire destroyed 1 residence and 10 acres of a vineyard. Ten homes, within the fire perimeter, and over 90 acres of vineyards were saved from the wildland fire due to aggressive firefighting during initial attack.
