Current Situation: CAL FIRE, Shasta County Sheriff's Department, Shasta County Public Works and PG&E are working diligently to eliminate hazards within the fires perimeter to re-populate evacuees. Firefighters continued to work throughout the night and into today strengthening controls lines and mopping up hot spots around the fire perimeter. A Damage Inspection Team will continue to assess the properties today in the affected communities. The evacuation center has been relocated to Igo Community Church at 6287 Placer St. Igo, CA.

Evacuations Orders: Residents have been advised to evacuate from the following areas:

- Clear Creek Road and Cloverdale Road
- Everything southwest to Gas Point Road and Small Farms and Marsha Way
- Gas Point Road and Happy Valley Road
- Small Farms track south to Black Pine Road
- Cloverdale from Clear Creek to Oak
- Oak to Palm
