Current Situation:

Firefighters continue to work in steep, rugged terrain with difficult access. Bulldozers and hand crews will continue to work throughout the night constructing containment lines. As containment of the fire increases, a demobilization plan will be implemented to release resources no longer being utilized for suppression and repair efforts.

While the smoke has diminished, it may affect the surrounding communities for several days.

All public roadways in the fire area have been reopened, however infrastructure repair in the area is continuing.
