Current Situation:

Crews will continue to work in steep, rugged terrain throughout the night. Firefighters will continue to improve containment lines and eliminate hotspots within the fire perimeter. As containment of the fire increases, resources will transition to repair efforts while others will be demobilized.

All public roadways in the fire area have been reopened. Infrastructure repair in the area is continuing and crews may be working near the roads. Please drive cautiously.
